But none of these were achieved by a single person, or even a large group of dedicated engineers. They are all results of generations and generations of innovators building upon each other.




If I could have a superpower, I would choose to have super senses.


## **Thinking Big!**


Although the dream was short, I can imagine what will happen if this dream becomes real. We can live happily without worrying about the supplies of masks and hand sanitizers at

## Pay More, Get Less

Lave you found out that commodities Cost more than they used to? Have you run out of money more quickly than before? Without a doubt, the coronavirus opens a Pandora's box of creating a host of problems such as more food waste and poverty. Most importantly, a rise in the inflation rate. Inflation is the decline in purchasing power of a given currency over time and is the elephant in the room. We always ignore the fact that a surge in the inflation rate carries a lot of weight now, likewise for the surge in petrol prices and the burden it puts on drivers. You might be curious why and how it has become a real problem.


Let's begin with the main culprit, Covid-19. Remember when everything was so normal before 2020? All industries were flourishing. Since the arrival of the coronavirus, innumerable individuals or companies have experienced financial distress, as well as industries facing the biggest uncertainty ever. As many countries began to impose restrictions on travel, hospitality and tourism were the first 'victims'. Companies which used to rely heavily on tourists have been losing substantial profits and most owners cannot afford to maintain their business and end up with a perfect storm of supply chain disruption. Processors cut down orders with growers. Eventually, the seed farmers receive very few orders. According to Business Insider, a farmer in the U.S was forced to bury 1.4 million pounds of potatoes. In fact, there are 570 million farms in the world, the amount of food surplus is way more than massive. But here's the problem, why are the groceries in supermarkets always out of stock?

According to Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), world cereal production in 2020 was 2776 million tons, followed by a 3-million-tonne increase

in 2021. Meanwhile, an average person consumes 0.9 tonnes of food per year. In light of this, it is evident that there is something wrong with the food supply chain. As we know, there are several links in the food supply chain, including production, point-of-sale staffing, and delivery. Each of them involves cost. If the cost of one changes, the disruption will cause a knockon effect. Let's say when the price of petrol rises due to the pandemic, the delivery charge for freight rises. Similarly, when the cost of crops being delivered to factories increases, making the meat more costly, it is the same as that of feeding livestock. By the way, some food may have already become rotten in the containers before transporting overseas because of the lockdown. It briefly explains how goods and business operating costs become elevated. This is also why some manufacturers downsize products not with the price so as to earn profits.

Meanwhile, 60 percent of the countries in the so-called advanced economies have annual inflation rates over 5 percent and above 7 percent for more than half the countries in emerging economies, according to the Bank for International Settlements. It's the largest share since the 1980s. Perhaps the data might not make you feel shaken up, but for the poor and the families dealing with debt, it's simply forcing them to skate on thin ice. If the change in inflation rate is greater than that of their income or they may even be unemployed, having a meal every day will cost them an arm and a leg. After all, the growth in the number of people suffering from hunger and poverty will be inevitable.

## Job Scams – Is It scary?

Pave you ever received any weird 'job finding' messages from your phone? Did you fall prey to these job hunting scams before? During the fifth wave of the pandemic outbreak, scammers may want you to fall into the trap so they can steal some money or some personal details through ill-intentioned job messages. In order to prevent all of you from falling into this trap, I would like to share a case of a job scam and tips to protect yourself.

At first, mostly the messages may talk about the benefits of doing this job. The scammers promise good money for a job that does not require much skill. Their messages tend to target people who are young and lack work experience. It is easy for students and those who are desperate to make money to trust what they read. What's more, some of the workers may have lost their job during the pandemic. Since one of the major expenditures for companies is the employee salaries, an increasing number of employees are facing salary cuts or are eventually sacked because of the economic downturn during the pandemic. The higher the unemployment rate, the more people are willing to find these online jobs.

Let me share a case of a job scam from my friend. My friend, who is a university year one student, wanted to earn a living through getting some part-time jobs. My friend found an online job that allowed him to work anytime, anywhere. My friend had to buy products on the online platform like Amazon and iHerbs. What my friend needed to do was to finish the task ordered by an unknown person. The unknown person would tell

my friend to buy some products, such as health supplements and skin-care products. After completing each task, my friend could get 10% bonus of extra money. If you have got some experience purchasing online, you know very well that you have to fill in your personal information and address before securing an order. After getting the confirmation email, my friend had to send a photo of the email to the unknown person on WhatsApp to show that my friend had already finished the task. For the first two 'jobs', it went quite smoothly as the scammer wanted to let my friend know that it was not a trap. Therefore, my friend could receive the bonuses he deserved.

On the third occasion, my friend couldn't get back the money. My friend texted the scammer and asked why. This time my friend paid one thousand dollars, so he felt a bit nervous. The scammer told him to send the bank account number again and he would pay immediately. Before my friend sent the bank account details and my friend even deposited some more money in his bank account. Two weeks later, my friend not only discovered that he couldn't receive any money, but he had also lost all the money in the account. When he tried to reach the scammer on Whatsapp, apparently, he was blocked and could not text or call the scammer anymore. My friend went to the police and reported the case. The police officer said that there should be no online selling jobs in Hong Kong. In addition, the police asked why he gave away sensitive personal information to strangers. The police asked him to call the bank in order to freeze his account immediately. My friend could only wait at home until further updates. Consequently, my friend realized that he couldn't get back any money. This experience tells us that we must not trust anyone in the virtual world.

Regarding the advice to prevent job scams, you should be on high alert when finding jobs online. One of the reminders is not to find jobs online. Some thieves may ask you to work on some tasks at home, and they just want to steal your money. If you want to find a job, you can find some companies which have good reputation, like H&M and Starbucks. As you may not know who

is talking to you when you are 'working' online, the chance of getting trapped will be increased. Another reminder is that people should not share any personal details with strangers. For example, they can use your bank account to make transactions for money laundering. Don't think that you are so confident to not get trapped on the internet as you are a secondary school student. The more confident you are, the higher the chance you might fall prey to scams.



# Carrying the Heartbeat of Hong Kong

The Hong Kong Mass Transit Railway, more commonly known as the 'MTR', is a massive transport network serving Hong Kong. We use it nearly every day, but how much do we know about it? It doesn't matter if you don't know. Let's find out, shall we?

#### **Background and History**

Back during the early 1960's, the Hong Kong government saw a need of new transportation as Hong Kong's economy began skyrocketing. A study recommended the construction of a 64-kilometer-long rapid rail transit system underground. The rail network would connect the Kowloon Area and Hong Kong Island and soon connect to the New Territories as well. The name 'MTR' was established, which meant Mass Transit Railway. Fast forward several years and the MTR expanded with many new lines. In 2007, the other railway company KCR or Kowloon-Canton Railway which operated mainly in the New Territories and Kowloon areas merged with MTR, allowing for Intercity trains from mainland China and creating the massive railroad network we know of today.

## **Special Railway Lines**

There are many railway lines in the MTR, in total consisting of 10 as of 2022. It would take hours to describe every line within the MTR, so instead I will be listing out the 'special' ones. Firstly, the Disneyland Resort Line. This iconic railway line consists of 2 stations and a never-seen-before train designed after

the Disneyland theme. This line connects Sunny Bay with the popular Disneyland theme park. It's also

the shortest railway line in Hong Kong. Moving on, we have the Airport Express. This high-speed railway line connects Hong Kong's major populated areas to the Hong Kong International Airport in Chek Lap Kok. The line consists of 5 stations and a marked Airport Express livery train which contains a baggage coach. This express service runs up to 135 kilometers per hour, ensuring that passengers are never late for their flights.

#### **Upcoming Extensions**

In 2022, the MTR railway expansion of the East Rail Line Cross-Harbour Extension was completed and opened to the public. There are more extension plans underway. The Tung Chung Line Extension is one of these projects that is yet to begin construction. It will extend the Tung Chung Line for approximately 1.3 kilometers westwards to a new station in the west of Tung Chung, it will also have a new station at Tung Chung East, diverting the existing operating track somewhere between Sunny Bay and Tung Chung to connect to this new station. The other major extension is the Northern Link, a project that connects the East Rail Line with the Tuen Ma Line. Providing a better and faster way to reach everyone's destinations. The MTR has much more to offer and many things to improve upon.

The MTR is every Hong Kong citizen's go-to way of getting around the city and surrounding areas. With its ever-expanding railway network and quality services, it's best for us to know some knowledge about something we use nearly every day. I hope this article can raise some attention and interests for the MTR.

Meanwhile, planes continued to be used in various types of missions for different purposes until the first passenger aircraft was built in the 1940's, where people started to use aircraft for transportation purposes other than ships and vehicles, which would take much longer.

Now you may be wondering why aircraft models are shaped like they are now. Aircraft inventors were inspired by birds that fly with wings. It is called the aerodynamic design, which allows wind to flow smoothly over and under the wings. This design allows planes to fly steadily in the sky with the help of engines thrusting forward which pushes the plane forward. Normally, air will cause friction pushing the plane backwards, which would impact the speed and stability of the aircraft, but with the aerodynamic design, the impact is minimized, and the speed of the plane is increased significantly.

## Foul Language but Beautiful Food

Grdon Ramsay is a celebrity British chef that has 35 restaurants and has a total of 16 Michelin stars. He is also notorious for his temper and for his incredibly funny insults at incompetent cooks when working in the kitchen. He also hosted pop TV programs like Hell's Kitchen and MasterChef.

Gordon Ramsay was born in Scotland on November 8<sup>th</sup>, 1966. When he was 5, he moved to England. Gordon's first love was soccer, and he set his sights on a professional sports career. At the age of 15, the talented Gordon joined 'Glasgow Rangers', a pro club. However, he only lasted 3 years, until 1985 when an injury DESTROYED his hopes and dreams for a professional sports career. Since he had nothing else to do, he was forced to start over, so he returned to school earning a degree in hotel management in 1987.

After finishing his studies, Ramsay set his goal to become one of Europe's top chefs. He apprenticed with Marco Pierre White at Harvey's in London, worked for Albert Roux at Le Gavroche, then worked under master chefs Joel Robuchon and Guy Savoy in France.

In 1993, Ramsay struck out on his own as head chef of the newly opened Aubergine in London where, over the course of three years, he earned the restaurant a two-star rating from Michelin. More personal prestige followed in 1995 when Ramsay was awarded Newcomer of the Year at the prestigious Catey Awards, an Oscars-like event for the restaurant and hotel business.

When the restaurant's financial backing became shaky, Ramsay left Aubergine and opened his own establishment, Restaurant Gordon Ramsay, in 1998 in London. Hailed as a destination for high-end foodies, the restaurant eventually received a three-star rating from Michelin.

The next several years proved to be a whirlwind for the ambitious, hard-driving and temperamental Ramsay. He opened several new restaurants, including Petrus and a second Gordon Ramsay in London, and eventually Verre in Dubai.

Named Chef of the Year at the 2000 Catey

Awards and Independent Restaurateur of the Year in 2006, Ramsay brought his restaurant business to the U.S. in 2006 with the opening of two establishments at The London NYC. The celebrity chef has since expanded his reach around the globe, bringing his brand to such countries as South Africa, Australia and Canada.

Ramsay's migration to television began in 1996 with his appearance as a judge on the BBC competitive cooking show *MasterChef*. In 1999, he was the focus of a British documentary miniseries, *Boiling Point*, which tracked his working life as he opened his first restaurant. The success of that documentary spawned a follow-up miniseries, *Beyond Boiling Point*, in 2000.

Ramsey was tapped to host two programs in the spring of 2004: In *Ramsay's Kitchen Nightmares*, he sought to turn around failing restaurants, and in *Hell's Kitchen*, he ran a cooking competition among 10 celebrities, with audiences voting off contestants.

With reality television in full bloom in the U.S., the time was ripe for Ramsay to make his move across the Atlantic. In May 2005, an American version of *Hell's Kitchen*, which placed aspiring restaurateurs under the intense eye of the show's host, debuted on FOX. Like their British counterparts, American audiences learned to love and hate the abrasive chef as he narrowed the field of participants down to one final winner. Meanwhile, he launched another culinary series back in the U.K., *The F Word*.

Ramsay's strong ratings on U.S. screens opened the door for an adaptation of *Kitchen Nightmares*, which debuted in September 2007. That, in turn, led to the American productions of *MasterChef* and *MasterChef Junior* (2013), with Ramsay heading the group of judges. In 2012, he added another show to his schedule, a variation of his "save a failing establishment" theme with *Hotel Hell*.

Along with his work on TV and in his restaurants, Ramsay has written more than 20 books. His various businesses have been consolidated into Gordon Ramsay Holdings Limited.



## **Comfort for Your Fingertips**

low much do you know about custom keyboards? Keyboards have been around since the late 1860s, beginning with the invention of the typewriter. Which slowly made its way to the now common black, thin membrane keyboard. The first creation of a custom keyboard is still a mystery, but it started becoming popular around 2012. Unlike the black membrane keyboards, custom keyboards often use a mechanical switch. Membrane keyboards use rubber domes which then make contact to a receiver on the keyboard and register as a key press. While mechanical keyboards use a springloaded mechanism to press a switch, therefore resulting in a more satisfying and more customizable switch.

A keyboard can sound different depending on how you want to modify it, with the differences typically being referred as thock and clack in the custom keyboard community. Thock is described as low pitch and deep while clack is described as higher pitch and 'clacky'. But a single component doesn't make a keyboard clacky or thocky, to make a keyboard clacky or thocky you need to think about what switches, stabilizers, keycaps, plate, pcb and case you use. But the thickness of the plate, pcb and the type of switch you use also matters. You can also lubricate the switch to make it sound better and smoother. And sometimes the price can go up to thousands of dollars depending on what part you choose, as a result, many people go for more budget options.

Overall, getting into custom keyboards is a complicated and sometimes expensive hobby and you will encounter many problems like the stabilizers rattling, waiting due to group buys and items not being in stock. Despite the large cost and long waiting time, I think this is still a very interesting and entertaining hobby for people to get into and spend their free time on.
